

## MIVO Annual Report - 2021

Here are some 2021 highlights for our MIVO friends and followers: .

In 2021, blessings were plentiful for some while major trials surrounded others. Yet, our Lord remained faithful. As the country of Haiti faced challenges and tragedies, The MIVO Foundation, by the grace of our Father, continued to persevere with its divinely inspired mission. Many of you know that in seasons of drought, roots grow even deeper in search of water. Our MIVO Orthopedique Centre in L'Estere, Haiti, continued to provide loving care to those in need. We are more grounded and secure than we were 12 months ago.

- The clinic continued to see patients 5 days per week, approximately 60 patients or more per week. Two new Haitian RNs were hired in 2021 to make a total of 6 nurses. Security staff was also enhanced to ensure a safer environment for all.
- The rear wall of our residence building was rebuilt as it suffered damages from the August 2021 earthquake. And, the entire building was repainted.
- In October 2021, a mission team of 7 medical professionals joined the Haitian staff to perform orthopedic surgeries as well as provide non-surgical care to hundreds of patients. Reverend Dr. Gracia Etienne preached that October Sunday from the front porch of the clinic as a local church, patients, and staff joined us in thanksgiving. Dr. James Souffrant, a Haitian orthopedic surgeon, joined us on the team for the 3rd time! Church members prayed with our patients all week, while several declared Jesus as their Lord and Savior for the first time! We were blessed to be able to continue to share the gospel through words and deeds. **God is faithful! Bondye fidel!!!**
- The foundation here in the states out of York, PA, grew. We believe God is using this critical time for us to better prepare for future days. We formed 3 ongoing subcommittees in 2021: 1) One focuses on strategic planning as we forge ahead with plans to build a medical campus with an inpatient hospital on our land in L'Estere, Haiti. 2) Another subcommittee coordinates stateside events, such as picking up donations, assessing supply needs, sorting and packing donations to be sent to the clinic. 3) The third subcommittee partners with committed Christian churches near and far to pray specifically for Haiti as a country and for The MIVO Foundation as we seek Holy Spirit's directives.

\*      Mivo benefited from the services of Mission Aviation Fellowship (MAF) and Food For The Poor (FFTP). MAF shuttled our October team from Port au Prince to an airstrip within 15 minutes drive from our clinic. FFTP transported 2 skids of clinic supplies to Haiti as our main ocean port remained closed to receive our trailers of supplies. In addition, Churches partnered with us in prayer for a radical change in the hearts of Haitian leadership and wisdom for those making decisions.

With each passing day, God brought opportunities to serve in His name. For those interested in the financial aspect of the foundation, please refer to our pie chart for the year of expenditures.

These numbers reflect greater expenditures than funds received. Alas, in December of 2021, MIVO was in the process of renovating a home to flip in York, PA. That explains the negative balance.
